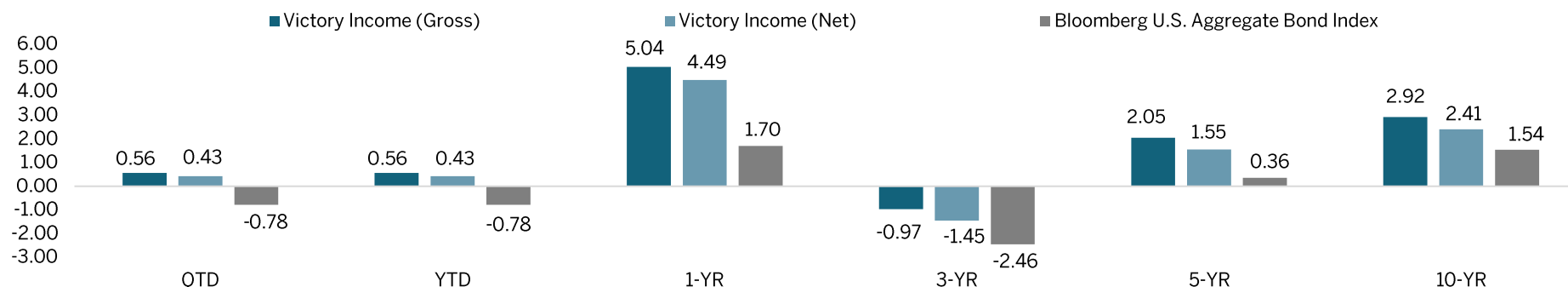

HISTORICAL COMPOSITE PERFORMANCE (%)

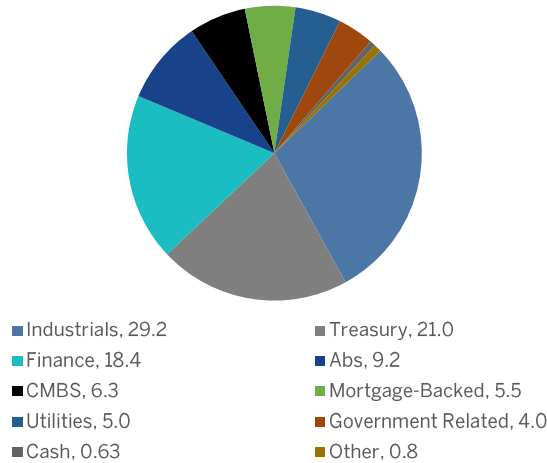

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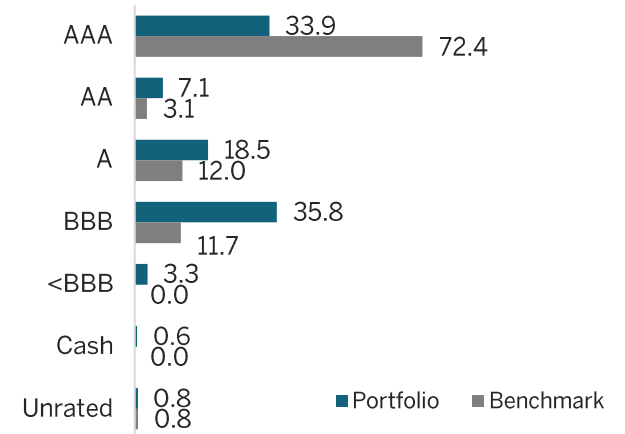
SECTOR ALLOCATION

The Victory Income Composite includes all institutional and retail portfolios invested primarily in U.S. dollar-denominated fixed-income securities that have been selected for their high yields relative to the risk involved. The fixed-income securities in which the composite portfolio invests include obligations of U.S., state, and local governments, and their agencies and instrumentalities; mortgage- and asset-backed securities; corporate debt securities; and repurchase agreements. Composite portfolios also may invest in income-producing common stock, preferred securities, and other securities believed to have debt-like characteristics. The strategy aims to deliver maximum current income without undue risk to principal. High yield bonds carry increased levels of credit and default risk and are less liquid than government and investment grade bonds. The composite creation date is July 2019 and the composite inception date is April 1974. The benchmark of the composite is the Bloomberg U.S. Aggregate Bond Index. Prior to 4/24/2023, the name of this composite was the USAA Income Fixed Income Composite.

The benchmark of the composite is the Bloomberg U.S. Aggregate Bond Index. The Bloomberg U.S. Aggregate Bond Index measures the performance of the investment grade, U.S. dollar-denominated, fixed-rate taxable bond market, including Treasuries, government-related and corporate securities, mortgage-backed securities (agency fixed-rate and hybrid adjustable rate mortgage (ARM) pass-throughs), asset-backed securities, and commercial mortgage-backed securities. The benchmark returns are provided to represent the investment environment existing during the time periods shown and are not covered by the report of independent verifiers. For comparison purposes, the index is fully invested, which includes the reinvestment of income. The returns have been taken from a published source and do not include any transaction fees, management fees, or other costs.
